Be Prepared for August 6th Primary Election

Residents are currently being inundated with election-related materials, many of which are from third parties. Mail, phone, texts, and more. With so much information coming your way from so many different sources, election confusion can result. Official and person-specific information is readily available. One source is the Bloomfield Township webpage where you can obtain some of the latest information and updates and useful election forms. Another source is the State of Michigan Voter Information website, mvic.sos.state.mi.us. There, you can electronically register to vote and apply for an absentee ballot and ultimately track your absentee ballot through the issuing and approval process. Or, if you

want to talk to a person about election procedures, contact me or my staff in The Clerk's Office.

Early voting for the August Primary will be at the Bloomfield Township Library starting Saturday, July 27th and ending Sunday, August 4th. The hours each day are 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., except Thursday when the hours are noon to 8:00 p.m. At early voting, bring your absentee ballot to personally send it through the tabulator. If you were not sent an absentee ballot or lost/destroyed that ballot, you will be issued a precinct ballot to complete and tabulate.

My office has mailed absentee ballots to all qualified voters who have submitted a valid application. The ballot was mailed to the voter's address on file (home or alternate as the voter has indicated). When a ballot is issued to a voter, it has a serial number that is assigned to that specific voter, which allows it to be tracked. Of course, any supposed ballot returned that we did not issue is obvious and is not tabulated. Any ballot returned without the numbered stub or containing a different number will be tabulated as a challenged ballot, which allows a court to identify that ballot in case voter eligibility has to be resolved during any recount. We check every signature against your signature on your drivers' license or other state identification. If the voter's signature on the return absentee ballot envelope is not completed or does not match the signature on file, the ballot is rejected and the voter is advised. In such a situation, you can still vote by appearing in the precinct or by remedying the absentee ballot signature issue before 5 p.m. the Friday after Election Day. The Clerk's Office contacts voters to alert them of a rejection due to a signature issue so that it can be timely remedied.


To return your absentee ballot, we encourage you to place it into a Township drop box or leave it directly with the Clerk's Office. The return envelope contains prepaid postage, but mail delivery times are highly variable, so do not delay and return your absentee ballot today. To be eligible for counting, the Clerk must receive the return envelope containing your ballot by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

Treasurer's Turn: Payment Options Abound

Summer's here and that means you should be receiving your summer property tax statement soon. Taxes are payable July 1st through September 16th, since the usual due date of September 14th falls on a weekend. If a mortgage company is paying your tax, you will receive an "information copy" to show you the allocation of your tax payment, instead of a regular invoice. The Treasurer's Office takes great pride in making multiple payment options available to taxpayers, all shown on the back of your tax statement.



Please note that any payments by credit card will include a processing fee added to your tax payment. We strongly encourage taxpayers to use one of the payment options listed above. If you choose to put your payment in the mail, please allow for two to three weeks for delivery, as we have seen delivery times vary greatly. We count a payment as timely when it is received in our office, not based on the postmark.

New Township Mobile App Offers Residents Higher

We're excited to announce the launch of the Bloomfield Township App! This app aims to bring the Township into your hands like never before with easy on-the-go access to services. The app can be downloaded for free in the App Store for iPhones and Google Play for Android. Scan the QR code to learn more and find a direct link to download.

Once on the home screen, you'll see scrolling news items as well as four icons for Click and Report, Local

Podcasts & Media, Senior Center, and Map. More options can be found in the "hamburger" menu (the three horizontal lines in the top left corner) such as Township News and the Budget Book.

Click and Report is one of the most notable features which allows residents the option to take a photo related to their question or concern and send it directly to the necessary department. Options Safety Path Maintenance, Refuse & Recycling, Street Maintenance, Code Enforcement, and more! For example, if you see a tree limb or debris blocking a safety path on your morning walk, you can open the app, select Click & Report, then select Safety Path Maintenance. You have the option to select an image from your camera roll or take a photo in the app. An email will be generated to send to the Environmental & Engineering Services Dept. where you can include any relevant information such as the location on the safety path.



Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off Day is

Residents will be able to dispose of hazardous waste this fall, when the popular Household Hazardous Waste Drop Off Day event returns to the Township campus. This is the perfect opportunity to clean out your garage and basement, in an environmentally sound way. Household Hazardous Waste crews will be on hand on Saturday, September 28 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. to take items such as drain cleaners, weed killer, gasoline, motor oil, starter fluid, transmission fluid, paint, fluorescent light bulbs/PBC ballasts, household batteries



LEASH/SANITATION LAWS

While walking your dogs this spring, remember that dogs must be on a leash and under control at all times. Owners are also required to pick up after their dogs under Township ordinance and dispose on their own property.



PET LICENSES

Only dogs need to be licensed in the Township. Purchase or renew yours at the BT Police Department or through Oakland County.

Residents wishing to install an invisible fence must first obtain a permit from the Building Division.

FAQ's for Public Safety Millage Renewal

Is this a new tax? A new SAD? Wasn't this issue on the | What can voters expect if the renewal is approved? ballot in 2022?

Bloomfield Township has three dedicated public safety millages. That means those funds can only be used towards

public safety costs. In 2022, voters approved a new public safety millage that combined two existing millages due for renewal into one. This current renewal is not a new tax or SAD, but would renew an existing millage. And due to Headlee Amendment rollbacks it will be levied at a lower rate not to exceed \$.6474 per \$1,000 of taxable



value instead of the millage's initial rate of \$1.0. If the millage expires the Public Safety fund would lose 4 million dollars in revenue or approximately 9% of its budget.

Why is this on the ballot now if the current millage does not expire until December 2025?

No elections are currently scheduled in 2025. By appearing on the August Presidential Primary ballot, the Township avoids any costs incurred by holding a special election in 2025. Additionally, knowing the result of the vote allows for better planning in advance than waiting until the expiration is close.

The Public Safety Fund maintains and residents continue to receive the first-class service they have come to expect. Available positions are able to be filled and public safety can

> budget for the technology and training that makes them leaders in the field.



At the April 2024 Board of Trustees Meeting, ballot language was approved for the August primary on a public safety millage renewal. What is the ballot language?

Shall the Charter Township of Bloomfield renew and continue to levy the voter authorized public safety tax levy of .6474 mills, due to expire in 2026, authorizing a levy of \$.6474 per \$1,000 of taxable value to finance the Charter Township of Bloomfield's continued providing of fire, police, and public safety protection, for a period of 10 years, with the renewed millage to be levied commencing in December 2026. This renewal public safety millage will be subject to applicable statutory and constitutional tax limitation provisions at the time of the levy and will not exceed the above stated rate. It is estimated that this proposal would result in the authorization to collect \$4,000,000 in the first year if approved and fully levied. Shall this proposal be adopted?

SENIOR SERVICES

Center Celebrates 15 Years and Looks to the Future

Since opening in 2009, the Senior Center has been a hub of activity for residents aged 50 and older. Senior Services marked the fifteenth anniversary recently by dedicating a bench in honor of longtime volunteer leader Stephen Eskoff and hosting a sold-out celebratory luncheon. While the anniversary reflected on the road traveled to success, Director Christine Tvaroha keeps an eye to the future thinking about how to ensure the department serves the community another fifteen years - to 2039 and beyond.

"This August marks 20 years since voters approved the millage for Senior Services and started the transition from

the school district to the Township," said Tvaroha. "In the past 15 years we have had the honor of serving over 10,000 people with our mission of promoting wellness,
